Class # 16: Color, Texture, Line & Shape with free motion

Supply list:

Bring the following items with you and label your supplies.

- Sewing machine capable of free motion sewing/free motion foot (Feed dogs drop)
- Sketch Pad, pencil, eraser
- Thin and thick black permanent marker (Sharpie)
- Small color wheel
- Rotary cutter and cutting mat
- Scissors
- Straight pins (ball head)
- Power extension cable
- A good range of colored machine threads (lights, medium, darks, warm and cool) and black, white, and gray
- a reel of monofilament thread (loaded on bobbin)
- Stitch ripper
- Spray adhesive or basting spray
- Bring fruit to draw, one or two
- Cushion for your chair

Fabric Supplies

Specifying the amount of fabric you need is hard, as some people work large and some work small. Others work fast and some work slow. If in doubt, bring more than you need.

- From 2 yards black and 2 yards white, prepare 8 fat quarters, sandwiched with black cotton on one side, white on the other and cotton batting in between.

In addition to this please bring;

- Black, White, and Gray cotton; 1 meter of each
- Colored fabric; fat quarters +/- of hand-dyes, dye-painted and discharged cloth. Warm (red, orange, yellow,) and cool (blue, green) colors and your personal palette of colors.
- Batting; 2 meters
- a sample of strip piecing; this needs to be at least 3" wide and no less than 18" long. The strips can be in any color range and width, but each color you use must have a 1 1/2 " strip of black in between. Sew quarter inch seams. With this, bring a backing fabric large enough for the strip, and the batting to go with it.
- Work-in-Progress; bring a sandwich/quilt that you would like to start or having trouble deciding where to start.
