Class # 23: Printing with Found Objects

Supply List:

2-3 yds light & medium color cotton fabrics: hand-dyed or commercial, solid or small prints that read as solid. (bring ugly or outdated fabrics to print on)

several small squeegees, 4"- 6" wide: inexpensive Bondo scrapers, wallpaper smoothers, or old credit cards will do.

varied colors of textile paint

Please order 4 oz. jars of ProFab paints from ProChem in the following colors: white, black, red, blue, and both #10 yellow & #12 yellow. 1-800-2BUY DYE or <http://www.prochemical.com>.

2 blank silkscreens (see below for ordering info if you don't own one)

Please order silkscreens from Dick Blick : 1-800 447-8192 or <http://www.dickblick.com>, # C43422-1009. 10" x 12" wooden frame silkscreen with 8xx or 12xx polyester mesh. If they don't have that size, any size is fine.

padding print surface for pinning fabric into: i.e., a 24"x24" piece of pink insulation foam & carpet padding or batting and an old sheet.

"Found" or household objects to print with: i.e., corrugated cardboard, rubber matting, sponges, doilies, mesh bags, wood or Lucite blocks & rubber bands.

freezer paper
masking tape
paper towels
duct tape for taping screen frames
scissors
small plastic containers or yogurt cups for paint
spray bottle for water
2 rubber brayers
styrofoam plates for rolling out and mixing paint
foam brushes
plastic spoons
straight pins

Optional

textile paints in metallics or colors you have at home: Setacolor, Jacquard, Lumière, etc.
rubber stamps - home made or purchased
Thermofax screens, if you have them already made.
oil pastels or Shiva Paintstiks
